The Frances McClelland Vision Award honors a community leader who has made a lifelong commitment and significant contributions to the well-being of children, youth, and families. The community leader embodies the strength, dedication, vision, and passion that Frances McClelland exhibited throughout her life. This award is for a community leader who has dedicated their life and work to helping Frances McClelland's legacy and vision come to fruition for the people of Southern Arizona and the world. The community leader should have at least 15 years of established commitment to improving the lives of children, youth, and families in Southern Arizona and the world.

The Richard Elías Legacy Award honors an individual who works with the Southern Arizona community to build resilience, work for justice, and honor the beauty and heritage of our community and its members. As a champion of our unique Sonoran desert and its people, this individual exemplifies many of the admirable qualities of Richard Elías: a person who is dedicated and willing to take risks, who is approachable and open to everyone in the community, and who promotes equity and opportunity. In line with his work, we particularly encourage nominations of DACA recipients for this award.

The Frances McClelland Youth Vision Award honors a youth leader or group of youth leaders who are working towards improving the well-being of children, youth, families, and communities. The youth embody the strength, dedication, vision, and passion that Frances McClelland exhibited throughout her life and youth. This award is for a youth leader or a group of leaders who inspire hope for Arizona's future. We are looking for youth that embody Frances' spirit of valuing her immigrant roots, overcoming adversity, and demonstrating resilience in the face of challenges. This candidate would be interested in future careers in family, health, criminal justice, psychology, social work, healthcare, teaching, and other related fields. The youth leader or group of leaders should be between 11-22 years old.

The Josefina Ahumada Spirit Organizational Award recognizes a local organization that embodies the spirit, commitment, perseverance and legacy of Josefina Ahumdada. The nonprofit community organization 1) supports, promotes or advocates for community, individual or family resiliency, 2) serves the community by offering support that addresses our community's needs, such as basic needs, resource access and health and psychological well-being, and 3) serves our most at-risk community members.
